## Machine That Fools Telephone Equipment Results in 3 Arrests

Three Cornell University engineering students were arraigned in City Court this morning on criminal charges that they defrauded the New York Telephone Co. by using an electronic device of their own manufacture to avoid paying toll charges on long distance calls.

The three were Stuart S. Pattison, 22, Hoyt A. Stearns Jr., 19, and Seth J. Stowell, 19. They are members and residents of Triangle house at 1 Campus Rd. Their cases were adjourned for a week so that they may get counsel.

Ithaca Detective Sgt. Lew Cornelius led the group of police and telephone company agents which visited Triangle frater-nity shortly after 9 p.m. Saturday.

As the group entered the house, Cornelius said today, "the band was playing but nobody was dancing and the bar was deserted.'

They made their way upstairs to a student room where they said they found a group of about 40 persons watching a demonstration involving an ordinary telephone and a homeelectronic instrument made which looks like a component of a high fidelity set.

District Attorney Richard Thaler said today this was one of several weekend demonstrations which saw about 150 long distance calls go all over the


